The Witness of God (vv. 9-12)

VERSE 12 He who has the Son has the life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have the life (ὁ ἔχων τὸν υἱὸν ἔχει τὴν ζωήν· ὁ μὴ ἔχων τὸν υἱὸν τοῦ θεοῦ τὴν ζωὴν οὐκ ἔχει [d.a.w/pres.act.part.nom.m.s. echo have + d.a.w/noun acc.m.s. huios + pres.act.ind.3s. echo have + d.a.w/noun acc.f.s. zoe life + d.a.w/pres.act.part.nom.m.s. echo + neg me + d.a.w/noun acc.m.s. huios + d.a.w/noun gen.m.s. theos + neg ouk + pres.act.ind.3s. echo]).

ANALYSIS: VERSES 9-12

- 1. In verse 9a John offers the observation that we regularly receive the witness of men regarding events.
- 2. "If we receive the witness of men" and we do (1st class condition) sets the stage for the witness of God (v. 9c).
- 3. The witness of God is superior to the witness of men since its source is divine perfection (omniscience and veracity).
- 4. The witness of God regarding the way of salvation came to us via men through whom the Holy Spirit bore witness (Jn. 5:36).
- 5. John's point is that if we are accustomed to receiving the witness of humans (on a wide range of subjects), we ought not to reject the witness of God.
- 6. God Himself is a more reliable witness, and usually what He bears witness to is of far greater value and is without error.
- 7. Foremost among the things He has borne witness to is His Son.
- 8. Those believers living at the 1st Advent were eyewitness and saw the attestation to the Son of God (1 Jn. 1:1; Jn. 19:35; 21:24; 2 Pet. 1:16).
- 9. They, in turn, were witnesses to the second generation of Christians (Jn. 15:27; 1 Jn. 1:2, 3; Heb. 2:3).
- 10. Further, they were commissioned to write four separate accounts of the life of Christ.

- 11. John's gospel contains seven selected signs to convince men of the truth pertaining to Jesus (Jn. 20:30, 31).
- 12. The greatest witness God has given is the one regarding His Son (v. 9c).
- 13. God the Holy Spirit continues to bear witness with our human spirit that we are sons of God and have the truth (Rom. 8:16).
- 14. When a person believes in the Son of God this person has in him the witness/testimony via the IHS (v. 10a).
- 15. On the other hand, the person who rejects the Gospel is guilty of calling God a liar (v. 10b).
- 16. The Spirit of God cannot lie as He is absolute veracity.
- 17. This veracity is also seen in the WOG.
- 18. To call God a liar is blasphemy and the individual is guilty of the unpardonable sin—rejection of Christ as the Savior.
- 19. The basis for making God out to be liar is found in v. 10c—namely, that the individual has rejected "the witness that God has given concerning His Son."
- 20. The witness regarding the Son of God is tied to the fact that the one who accepts this witness has eternal life (v. 11).
- 21. And eternal life is connected inseparably to God's Son (v. 11).
- 22. In v. 12 we have the bottom line.
- 23. "He who has the Son has life, and the one who does not have the Son does not have life."
- 24. It is just that simple and absolute!
- 25. Observation: when a person calls someone a liar, who isn't a liar, that person is a liar.
- 26. Note Jn. 3:33 "He who has received His testimony has set his seal (aor.act.ind. *sphagizo* secure with a seal; syn. 'to acknowledge'; like our affidavit) to *this*, that God is true."
- 27. Compare 1 Jn. 1:10 dealing with a different subject.
- 28. E.L. is tied to accepting who and what Christ is
- 29. God, who is incapable of lying, has given us a promise (1 Jn. 2:25 "This is the promise which He made/promised to us—eternal life.").
- 30. When any person rejects a true doctrine that person is calling all who believe it liars.
- 31. The fact is that the person rejecting a doctrinal truth is the one who is a liar.
